This Order amends the Copyright and Performances (Application to Other Countries) Order 2008 (S.I. 2008/677). This Order applies copyright protection under Part I of the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 to works originating from Bermuda. This order also confers on Bermuda reciprocal protection under Part 2 of the Act which confers rights on performers and persons having recording rights in relation to performance.
