## Brief description of the notified legal text

These Regulations amend the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 ("the Act") by inserting new sections 44A and 76A, a new paragraph 6I in Schedule 2 and a new Schedule ZA1. The Regulations implement the provisions of Directive 2012/28/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25<sup>th</sup> October 2012 on certain permitted uses of orphan works (OJ No L 299/5, 27.10.2012, p.1).
