# REGISTERED DESIGNS ORDINANCE (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE) REGULATION 2005

(Made by the Chief Executive in Council under section 83 of the Registered Designs Ordinance (Cap. 522))

## 1. Commencement

This Regulation shall come into operation on 17 February 2006.

### 2. Paris Convention Countries and WTO Members

- (3) The Schedule is amended in the list under the heading "Countries which have acceded to the Paris Convention"—

- (4) The Schedule is amended in the list under the heading "Countries which have acceded to the Paris Convention"—

- (5) The Schedule is amended in the list under the heading "Countries which have acceded to the Paris Convention" by adding—
  - (a) "The Principality of Andorra";
  - (b) "Union of the Comoros";
  - (c) "The Republic of Namibia";
  - (d) "The Islamic Republic of Pakistan";
  - (e) "The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia";
  - (f) "The Republic of Seychelles".

- (6) The Schedule is amended in the list under the heading "Countries, territories and areas which have acceded to the World Trade Organization Agreement (not including countries which have acceded to the Paris Convention)" by repealing—
  - (a) "The Republic of Namibia";
  - (b) "The Islamic Republic of Pakistan".

# **Explanatory Note**
